






Mass Intentions for the Week

From the Desk of the Pastor

POWER OF PERSEVERING PRAYER

The parable of the persistent widow and the unjust judge is exclusive to Luke (18:18) and highlights the power of persevering, persistent and confident prayer. It is about humble faith and calls us to never give up and lose heart. Our God never gives up on us. Persistent prayer reshapes our hearts to God's designs and plans because His plans are better than our plans. God is swayed by persistent prayer because He involves Himself in the affairs of the world. He is an active agent and engages Himself in our human experience. This is very significant in our society today because we live in a world where almost everything is instant. We have instant communication, instant coffee, instant tea, instant weight loss program and we want instant results. We prefer quick fix solutions and thereby making us impatient and we are incapable to wait. Instead, patience is a virtue. The parable of the persistent widow and the unjust judge teaches the disciples the necessity to pray always without becoming weary. The context of this parable is that the Church of Luke is experiencing persecution and longs for the Parousia, the Second coming of Christ when He vindicates His people and ends their suffering. But the Parousia is long overdue and the disciples find it difficult to maintain their faith. Thus, this parable encourages them to trust in God's power and providence. It narrates two characters that represent opposite ends of the social spectrum. It contrasts the evil judge with our loving Father. The judge is the epitome of power but corrupt, unjust, dishonest and has no conscience, no compassion, no respect to human being and does not fear God. The widow is the epitome of powerlessness, vulnerability, no influence and support but displays unwavering faith, confidence and relentless in seeking for justice pestering the judge. She represents the Church of Luke that longs for the judgment of God, that final act in which God will reveal himself as the Champion of the poor and the oppressed and the Father of the widows and orphans. Finally, the judge gives in to the pestering of the widow not because he is suddenly converted but for fear of being worn out by her persistence. Her perseverance wins her justice. She is vindicated. That is why, Jesus wonders if He will find faith on earth when He returns at the end of time. Persistent faith is possible where there is persistent prayer. The power behind our faith is the power of God. True prayer is not about getting what we want from God because He already knows what we need. It is building our relationship with Him centering ourselves in His love. It is about growing our friendship, intimacy with Him nurtured by our persistent prayer. It allows God to use us. Therefore, our celebration of the Eucharist is the celebration of the Resurrection of Jesus which is the vindication of God raising Jesus from the dead, never to die again. Resurrection is new life beyond our imagination. God's response to sin and evil is not destruction and condemnation but always loving, healing and new life.

Persistent prayer empowers us to see with God eyes with mercy, truth and courage and that is new life.
