Religious Education Policies

2024-2025

Welcome back to the St. Agnes Religious Education Program! We are excited to begin a new year sharing our faith and learning about the love of God. Please review the following policies for your information. We appreciate your support and cooperation.

Class Times: Students in grades 1 through 6 meet weekly on Tuesday afternoons from 4:00 to 5:15 p.m.

Role of Parents: Parents are the primary educators of their children. They are "the most influential agents of catechesis for their children" and "catechize primarily by the witness of their Christian lives and by their love for the faith" (National Directory for Catechesis, p. 234). Parents are asked to support the catechists and the religious formation of their children, especially by being examples of the Faith. It is expected that parents and children will celebrate weekly Mass together. Attendance at weekly Mass is an integral part of each child's faith formation.

Role of the Religious Education Program and Catechists: The St. Agnes Religious Education Program provides students with a safe environment and systematic formal catechesis, which ensures effective faith and sacramental formation at each level. The goal of the catechist is to communicate God's love by proclaiming the Good News to those entrusted to his/her care. The catechetical program is in place to help students grow in their faith and spirituality; to bring them into the community of faith, its life, worship, symbols, and practices; and to pass on a shared set of Catholic values.

Attendance and Absences: Regular and prompt attendance are important to build an effective learning environment. If your child will be absent on a particular day, please call the Religious Education Office at 619-840-4241 or send an e-mail to let us know. Your child is expected to make-up any missed work. Three excused absences will be allowed and additional absences will be handled on an individual basis. Regular student attendance is required and excessive absences may be cause for intervention with the student and parents.

If your child will be picked up by someone other than a parent or guardian, please provide the office with a note (an e-mail is also acceptable in an emergency). Children will only be sent home with persons designated on the form titled *Authorization to Pick Up Student*.

<u>Behavior</u>: Students are expected to show respect for themselves, other students, and staff. When a student's behavior becomes disruptive to the class or is disrespectful toward the teacher, the student may be removed from the class and parents may be contacted. Repeated incidents of inappropriate behavior may result in dismissal from the program.

Parents: Please keep one copy of this paper for your records.

<u>Medical Information:</u> Parents should inform the office of any medical needs for their children. For students with severe allergies, an Epi-pen or other necessary treatment should be provided in case of emergency.

<u>School Dress</u>: In an effort to maintain a safe and distraction-free learning environment, please help your children choose clothing that is comfortable, but appropriate for attending religion classes. Students are not expected to "dress up" for class, but to apply the virtue of prudence in their choices.

<u>Attending Mass</u>: As the primary educators of their children, parents are expected to attend weekly Sunday Liturgies with their children. Our parish offers a Children's Liturgy of the Word during the 11:00 a.m. Sunday Mass for students from preschool age through 2nd grade.

<u>Parking/Drop-Off/Dismissal on Tuesdays</u>: Please enter from the driveway on Avenida de Portugal. Cones will be placed to show the designated traffic pattern. *Students should be dropped off no earlier than ten minutes before class and picked up within ten minutes of the end of class.* Students will be supervised in the first Conference Room while they are waiting to be picked up. Parents must come inside or to the door to pick up students.

<u>Electronic Devices</u>: *Please keep cell phones, musical devices, and other electronics at home*. If they are brought to the classroom, the teacher will hold them until the end of class.

St. Agnes Christian Service Requirements

"Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me."

-Matthew 25:40

Requirements: Confirmation Students and students in grades 7 and 8 are required to complete service hours. The Confirmation requirement is 20 hours per year, while the requirement for grades 7 and 8 is ten hours each year. Half of the service hours may be spent providing service to St. Agnes Parish (altar serving, etc.). The other half must be completed by serving in community outreach. Documentation of service hours must be submitted by the end of April. **Students not completing their service requirement by this date may be unable to re-register for the following year.**

What is service?

You have an opportunity to grow in your faith and knowledge of the world by offering your talents in service to others. Service is volunteer activity that goes beyond the help you lend to your immediate and extended families. It is a giving of your time for an organization that serves the community, for which you do NOT receive compensation, awards, or recognition. Some examples include serving the poor, visiting the elderly/infirmed, volunteering for a non-profit service organization, tutoring young children, etc. When you reach out to help people living in the community (city, state, world), you are doing a form of community service.

When thinking about whether your chosen activity "counts" as service, remember some of the Corporal Works of Mercy: Feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, clothe the naked, shelter the homeless, and visit the sick. Will the work you will do help to achieve one of these goals of charity toward your neighbor? If so, you are definitely on the right track, though not all service you do must achieve one of these specific goals. Other service might include serving dinner in the hall, being an altar server, setting up tables and chairs, etc.

Where do I serve?

When choosing an organization to work with, remember that there are two types of service:

Direct Service: Direct service puts you into contact with a person who is in some way marginalized. For example, serving at a soup kitchen, visiting a nursing home, or tutoring younger children are all types of direct Christian service

Indirect Service: Indirect service is an activity that does not put you in direct contact with a marginalized person, but does benefit those in need. For example, Habitat for Humanity, Father Joe's Thanksgiving 5K walk, working at the Food Bank, and any clothing or food drives are all types of indirect Christian service.

The organization for which you provide service *must not be in conflict with the values and beliefs of the Roman Catholic Church*. You may choose to serve with one of the organizations on the list of approved service sites or you may get approval from Mrs. Gonzalez if you plan to give service to an individual or organization not included on the list. **Please get approval BEFORE completing service hours if not choosing from the list of pre-approved sites.**
